RE: Articles of Impeachment Against President Donald John Trump for High Crimes and Misdemeanors, Filed on August 24, 2026

Dear Mr. President,

Sir, and still I rise to request that you accept this communiqué as my professional notice informing you that this morning, August 24, 2026, at 8:57 a.m. ET, I filed H.Res.1486, impeaching you for high crimes and misdemeanors. I have included a copy of H.Res.1486 herewith.

Mr. President, I take no pleasure in bringing articles of impeachment against you. I beg that you understand that this is not about Democrats versus Republicans, conservatives versus liberals, or the Left versus the Right. Mr. President, this is about right versus wrong and how you are destroying our democratic republic.

These articles of impeachment are about life and death. More explicitly, it's about the lives of Renée Good, Alex Pretti, Lorenzo Salgado Araujo, Johan Sebastián Durán Guerrero, and others who have died under your leadership without justice. It's about a cover-up you are condoning and participating in.

To be perspicuously clear, these articles of impeachment are about the Constitution and how you are reducing it to mere words on paper. It's about how you attempt to bully judges and disrespect the separation of powers. It's about how you condone violations of free speech and flout constitutionally mandated due process.

Mr. President, Vice President Cheney's warning is as true today as the day he first proclaimed, "In our nation's 246-year history, there has never been an individual who is a greater threat to our republic than Donald Trump."

Mr. President, I am well aware of the fact that you will be defended by persons who will say, 'The House won't impeach, and if it did, the Senate won't convict.' Sir, my response is that articles of impeachment that are not approved by Congress can express on-the-record disapproval of presidential actions and demonstrate that there are some of us watching and willing to act.

And, to those who will enjoy highlighting the number of Members who will oppose the articles I have filed, I sincerely say: I thank God for giving me the courage to stand and the wisdom to understand that on some issues, some causes, and some injustices, it is better to stand alone than not stand at all. Sir, your devolving of our democratic republic into an authoritarian regime is such an issue, such a cause, and such an injustice.
