3 **SEC. _____ 1. U.S. CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION.**

4 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
5 appropriated to the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and
6 Border Protection for fiscal year 2026, out of any money
7 in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
8 \$3,470,000,000, to remain available until September 30,
9 2029, for hiring, paying, training, and equipping U.S.
10 Customs and Border Protection agents, and the necessary
11 support staff, and to provide other necessary expenses for
12 U.S. Customs and Border Protection mission support and
13 operations and maintenance, in order to carry out immi-
14 gration enforcement activities.

15 **SEC. _____ 2. U.S. IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCE-**
16 **MENT.**

17 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
18 appropriated to the Director of U.S. Immigration and
19 Customs Enforcement for fiscal year 2026, out of any
20 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
21 \$30,725,000,000, to remain available until September 30,
22 2029, for the following purposes:

1 (1) HIRING, PAYING, AND TRAINING.—Hiring,
2 paying, training, and equipping U.S. Immigration
3 and Customs Enforcement personnel and the per-
4 sonnel for all its directorates, including officers,
5 agents, investigators, attorneys and support staff, to
6 carry out immigration enforcement activities.

7 (2) TRANSPORTATION.—Funding for transpor-
8 tation costs and related costs associated with alien
9 departure or removal operations.

10 (3) INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.—Funding for
11 information technology maintenance and
12 sustainment to support enforcement and removal op-
13 erations, including improvements to fee collections
14 and body-worn cameras.

15 (4) FACILITY MAINTENANCE AND
16 SUSTAINMENT.—Funding for facility maintenance
17 and sustainment to support enforcement and re-
18 moval operations.

19 (5) FLEET MAINTENANCE AND
20 SUSTAINMENT.—Funding for fleet maintenance and
21 sustainment to support enforcement and removal op-
22 erations.

23 (6) 287(G) AGREEMENTS.—Supporting coordi-
24 nation with state and local authorities by expanding,
25 facilitating, and implementing agreements under sec-

1 tion 287(g) of the Immigration and Nationality Act
2 (8 U.S.C. 1357(g)).

3 (7) OFFICE OF THE PRINCIPAL LEGAL ADVI-
4 SOR.—Hiring and paying attorneys and the nec-
5 essary support staff within the Office of the Prin-
6 cipal Legal Advisor.

7 (8) OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE.—Nec-
8 essary expenses for U.S. Immigration and Customs
9 Enforcement’s mission support, including awards,
10 and operations and maintenance for its immigration
11 enforcement functions.

12 **SEC. ____ 3. ADDITIONAL DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SE-**
13 **CURITY APPROPRIATIONS.**

14 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
15 appropriated to the Secretary of Homeland Security for
16 fiscal year 2026, out of any money in the Treasury not
17 otherwise appropriated, \$2,500,000,000, to remain avail-
18 able until September 30, 2029, for the purposes provided
19 in this title or in part II of subtitle A of title X of Public
20 Law 119–21.

21 **SEC. ____ 4. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.**

22 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
23 appropriated to the Attorney General for fiscal year 2026,
24 out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appro-

1 priated, \$1,457,000,000, to remain available until Sep-
2 tember 30, 2029—

3 (1) to support the missions of the Department
4 of Justice, including—

5 (A) investigatory and prosecutorial efforts
6 to support the mission of the National Security
7 Division on terrorism matters;

8 (B) the mission of the Drug Enforcement
9 Administration to enforce the controlled sub-
10 stances laws of the United States;

11 (C) the mission of the United States Mar-
12 shals Service to enforce the Federal laws under
13 its purview and to provide for the safety and se-
14 curity of the Federal justice system;

15 (D) the mission of the United States attor-
16 neys to prosecute criminal cases brought by the
17 Federal Government;

18 (E) the mission of the Federal Bureau of
19 Investigation regarding violations of Federal
20 public corruption laws and civil rights, and re-
21 garding violent, drug trafficking, child traf-
22 ficking and smuggling, and white collar crimes;

23 (F) the mission of the National Fraud En-
24 forcement Division regarding the commission of

1 fraud against the people of the United States;
2 and

3 (G) the missions of the Criminal Division
4 and the Executive Office for Immigration Re-
5 view to enforce and administer the Federal im-
6 migration laws; and

7 (2) consistent with section 530C of title 28,
8 United States Code, for providing reimbursement for
9 Federal, State, and local participation in the mis-
10 sions described in paragraph (1).

11 **SEC. _____ 5. UNITED STATES SECRET SERVICE.**

12 (a) APPROPRIATION.—In addition to amounts other-
13 wise available, there is appropriated to the United States
14 Secret Service, for fiscal year 2026, out of any money in
15 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$1,000,000,000,
16 to remain available until September 30, 2029, for the pur-
17 poses of security adjustments and upgrades, including
18 within the perimeter fence of the White House Compound
19 to support enhancements by the United States Secret
20 Service relating to the East Wing Modernization Project,
21 including above-ground and below-ground security fea-
22 tures.

23 (b) LIMITATION.—None of the funds made available
24 under this section may be used for non-security elements
25 of the East Wing Modernization Project.

1 (c) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term “East
2 Wing Modernization Project” means the project with the
3 file number 8733 entitled “East Wing Modernization
4 Project” for which the preliminary and final site and
5 building plans were approved by the National Capital
6 Planning Commission on April 2, 2026.
